

Daughters of the Republic of Texas Library Collection Finds New Home

SAN ANTONIO— Artifacts from Texas history will have a new home as collections from the Daughters of the Republic of Texas will be on display inside the old Federal Reserve Bank building.

Daughters of the Republic of Texas President General Betty Edwards said all 38,000 items in the collection will be moved.

Built in the 1950s, the old Federal Reserve Bank building was the first of its kind during the Cold War and served as a prototype for other Fed banks across the nation. Now it's in prime condition to protect pieces of history.

"We are embarking on an incredible process to revitalize, re-imagine the Alamo and what it means," said city councilman Roberto Trevino.

Bexar County owns the facility and will lease a portion to Texas A&M University-San Antonio. One of the most unique parts about the collaboration is the change in accessibility for members of the university and the entire community. Along with the Daughters' collection, it will house artifacts from county history, and academic archives for the school.



WHAT'S COOKING IN THE TEXAS HILL COUNTRY?

Kerrville Recipe

OVERNIGHT COFFEE CAKE

3/4 cup butter, softened 1 teaspoon baking soda

1 cup sugar 1/2 teaspoon salt 2 eggs 1 teaspoon nutmeg

1 cup sour cream 3/4 cup brown sugar, firmly packed 2 cups flour 1/2 cup walnuts, chopped

2 cups flour 1/2 cup walnuts, choppe 1 teaspoon baking powder 1 teaspoon cinnamon

In a large bowl, cream together butter and sugar until light and fluffy. Add eggs, one at a time, beating after each addition. Beat in sour cream. Sift together flour, baking powder, baking soda, salt and nutmeg. Add to creamed mixture; mix well. Pour batter into greased and floured 9 x 13 pan. Combine brown sugar, walnuts, and cinnamon; mix well. Sprinkle over batter. Cover and chill overnight. Uncover and bake in preheated 350 degree oven for 35-40 minutes or until wooden pick comes out clean.
